This letter is meant to be shared with loved ones and friends as the mourning individual strives to share the grief journey with them.

Dear Friend (family, pastor, fellow workers...),

Recently I have suffered a devastating loss. I am grieving and it will take months and even years to recover from this loss. I wanted to let you know that I will cry from time to time. I don't apologize for my tears since they are not a sign of weakness or a lack of faith. They are God's gift to me to express the extent of my loss, and they are also a sign that I am recovering.


At times you may see me angry for no apparent reason. Sometimes I'm not sure why. All I know is that my emotions are intense because of my grief. If I don't always make sense to you, please be forgiving and patient with me. And if I repeat myself again and again, please accept this as normal.

More than anything else I need your understanding and your presence. You don't always have to know what to say, or even say anything, if you don't know how to respond. Your presence and a touch or hug lets me know you care. Please don't wait for me to call you since sometimes I am too tired or tearful to do so. If I tend to withdraw from you, please don't let me do that. I need you to reach out to me for several months.

Pray for me that I would come to see meaning in my loss someday and that I would know God's comfort and love. It does help to let me know that you are praying for me. If you have experienced a similar type of loss, please feel free to share it with me.

This loss is so painful, and right now it feels like the worst thing that could ever happen to me. But I will survive and eventually recover.

Thank you for caring about me. Thank you for listening and praying. Your concern comforts me and is a gift for which I will always be thankful.

Zionsville Area Food Pantry is located at Zion's Lutheran Church; their mailing address is P.O. Box 56, Old Zionsville, PA 18068. Their phone number is 610-554-8340, you may text. The distribution for the food pantry is always the second Monday and following Wednesday and Saturday of each month. Monday and Wednesday distribution is 4-6 pm. Saturday distribution is 10 a.m. to 12 noon. You are always welcome to help and/or to visit/observe. It is a great operation. Clients are encouraged to have appointments but we do accept walk-ins too. During the Pandemic, distribution is drive-up in the parking lot. Parking attendants will help you park and wait for distribution. As church leaders, feel free to suggest to folks in need that this is available to them. They should call the phone number for a recorded message that explains the process to them.

For those who would like to help in other ways – Food can be dropped off at the church on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:00am–1:00pm. If you choose to do this, please check the expiration date and the quality of the item. No dented cans, opened containers can be accepted. They need future dated or items which are no more than 6 months past the expiration date.



And He made us pure in heart in every way.


The soldiers nailed Him to the cross on Good Friday,

Dear Friends:

Thank you for your generous donation of \$148.46 to the Sixth Street Shelter which was received on January 29, 2021. We sincerely appreciate the partnership of friends like you as we help families improve their stability, self-sufficiency, resilience, and quality of life.

The Sixth Street Shelter has been serving families with children who are experiencing homelessness for over 30 years. Last fiscal year the Sixth Street Shelter was able to shelter 106 families consisting of 373 people, 232 of whom were children. During their 60-day stay at the Shelter, families met regularly with a counselor to develop and work toward a plan to resolve their homelessness.

Residents at the Sixth Street Shelter learn how to solve their own problems and to take advantage of opportunities for personal growth. They develop and actively work toward long-term housing, employment, and educational goals during their stay. In addition to case management and referrals, we offer a variety of supportive programs including parenting classes, a computer lab, financial education, life skills development, group activities, field trips, character education, tutoring, and reading.

Thank you again for your gift to the Sixth Street Shelter. You are an important part of our work, and we are truly grateful for your involvement and support.
