From Pastor's Desk...

A lecturer on stress management raised a glass of water and asked his audience, "How heavy is this glass of water?" Various answers were called out. Then he replied, "The weight really doesn't matter. What matters is how long you try to hold it."

"If I hold it for a minute, that's not a problem," he said. "If I hold it for an hour, I'll have an ache in my right arm. If I hold it or a day, you'll have to call an ambulance. In each case, it's the same weight, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it becomes."

"And that's the way it is with stress," he said. "If we carry our burdens all the time, sooner or later, as the burden becomes increasingly heavy, we won't be able to carry on. You have to put it down for a while and rest before holding it again. When we're refreshed, we can carry on with the burden. So before you return home tonight," he continued, "put the burden of work down. Don't carry it home. You can pick it up tomorrow. Whatever burdens you're carrying now, let them down for a moment if you can. Relax; pick them up later after you've rested. Life is short. Enjoy it."



Food Pantry Update -

The number of clients in the building at one time is still being limited and we are managing the queue in the parking lot as people wait in their cars. For our clients with mobility issues, we continue to offer the prepacked bags we had during the pandemic contactless distribution.



Our current needs are around our standard distribution items. We still have limited pick items offerings as that slows down the distribution as people make selections.

While we continue to adjust our process, we will start using the odd ball – one off items. In the meantime, if you have any of those you can still donate as we are sharing those items with Grace Lutheran Church in Macungie. They are operating an independent pantry without state funding.
