Scripture Reading: Amos 8:1-12

Then the Lord said to me, "The end has come upon my people Israel; I will spare them no longer. 3 The songs of the temple shall become wailings on that day," says the Lord God; "the dead bodies shall be many, cast out in every place. Be silent!" 4 Hear this, you who trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, 5 saying, "When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale?
