

News from the Windows Committee...



Jindows Phase 2 of the restoration is now complete! The Cumberland crew spent five days during the last two weeks finalizing the Good Shepherd window. They scraped, repaired and painted the exterior trim and

installed the new protective glass covering. The result is an amazing transformation, both inside and out.

The committee is optimistic about raising enough money by the end of the year to begin Phase 3 - restoration of the Nativity window. In addition to funds already in the windows account, two major fund raisers are planned: a guilt sale during the summer and a matching gift challenge in the fall.

The Spring quilt auction was very successful, raising \$808. During July and August, three additional quilts will be offered for sale to members, friends and the community

on a first-come, first served basis. The first quilt, "Heart of Rose" is 107x106 and the price is \$450. The second quilt, "Spring Flower" is 112x103 and the price is \$500. The third is a vintage cross-stitched quilt in a poppy design. It is signed on the back "Fern Jacobs, York PA, 1982." It is 84x96 and the price is \$300. The quilts will be on display in the upper social hall and can also be



seen on our Facebook page. Arrangements can be made through the church office (610-

966-3601) to view them in person during the week.





In 2020, one member offered to match contributions to the fund up to \$2,000. The challenge raised over \$4,000 for Phase 1. In 2021, four members pooled resources and offered to match contributions up to \$6,000. The challenge raised over \$12,000 for Phase 2. A 2022 challenge is planned for the

fall to benefit Phase 3, but "challengers" are needed. If you would like to participate or would like more information, please see or contact Beth Massa (massaed@hotmail.com) or Ruth Stansfield (267-313-4348). As in the past, challengers will remain anonymous.

10 Facts You Never Knew About the 4th of July

Hancock" when referring to signing your name.

- 1. Thomas Jefferson was the main author of the Declaration of Independence. There were four others on the drafting committee: Roger Sherman, Benjamin Franklin, John Adams and Robert Livingston.
- 2. John Hancock was the first person to sign the Declaration of Independence. Likely because he was the President of Congress at the time, he signed in a large hand and at the center of the document, according to the National Archives. His bold signature is where we get the phrase "put your John
- 3. **Independence Day should have been celebrated on July 2, 1776.**Although the document was dated July 4, congress actually voted for independence from Great Britain two days prior on July 2, 1776. It apparently wasn't signed by everyone until a month later on August 2, 1776.
- 4. John Adams wrote a letter to his wife about how memorable Independence Day would be in American history... He was obviously right in his letter, he said the day should be celebrated with parades, bonfires and fireworks. Scarily accurate, right? ... but he thought it was celebrated on the wrong day. In fact, he was known to turn down invitations to 4th of July celebrations in protest. In his correspondence to his wife, Abigail Adams, he only referred to Independence Day as July 2nd.
- 5. The 'Pennsylvania Evening Post' was the first newspaper to print the **Declaration.** It came out in the newspaper on July 6, 1776 for everyone to see, after a local printer named John Dunlap produced copies of the declaration's manuscript.
- 6. **An estimated 2.5 million people lived in the nation in July 1776.** As of July 2021, about 331.8 million people live in the U.S., according to the United States Census.
- 7. Three presidents who signed the Declaration of Independence died on July 4. John Adams and Thomas Jefferson both died on July 4, 1826 on the 50th anniversary of the country's independence. James Monroe died five years later on July 4, 1831.
- 8. Calvin Coolidge was the only president born on the 4th of July. That probably helped his presidential campaign, right?
- 9. **U.S. soldiers got a special treat on the 4th of July in 1778.** George Washington helped the troops celebrate by allowing them a double ration of rum, according to Live Science.
- 10. The Liberty Bell rings 13 times every Independence Day to honor the 13 original states. Descendants of people who signed the Declaration of Independence tap the bell, located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at 2 p.m.



Worship on Wednesdays begins June 15 at St. Timothy Lutheran Church, Allentown

June 15 is the start of Worship on Wednesdays (WOW) at St. Timothy Lutheran Church, 140 S. Ott Street in Allentown. Each service includes singing led by a praise band or group, a brief sharing by a local charity, a Bible reading and message presented by a local clergyperson, and intercessory prayers. This summer the charity focus is on those organizations that serve children and youth. Music begins at 6:45 p.m. with the service starting at 7 p.m.

The services are held outdoors so worshippers are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs or blankets for seating. However, some benches and chairs are available, and people may remain in their cars. If the weather is inclement, the service will be held indoors and face masks are recommended. **Everyone is welcome!**
