**The Lehigh Valley Old Time Jammers** meet in the Upper Milford Mennonite Sunday School area (1<sup>st</sup> floor) on the 1st & 3rd Tuesdays of each month. This group of musicians love old time music and play the fiddle, banjo, guitar, and other acoustic instruments. They do not do a formal performance but just come and 'jam' (make music). If you enjoy this music and want to listen (or have an instrument and want to play), join us!

**Labor Day** in the United States is a public holiday celebrated on the first Monday in September. It honors the American labor movement and the contributions that workers have made to the strength, prosperity, laws and well-being of the country. It is the Monday of the long weekend known as **Labor Day Weekend** and it is considered the unofficial end of summer in the United States. The holiday is also a federal holiday.



Beginning in the late 19th century, as the trade union and labor movements grew, trade unionists proposed that a day be set aside to celebrate labor. "Labor Day" was promoted by the Central Labor Union and the Knights of Labor, which organized the first parade in New York City. In 1887, Oregon was the first state of the United States to make it an official public holiday. By the time it became an official federal holiday in 1894, thirty U.S. states officially celebrated Labor Day.

On **October 2, 2022** there will be a **Special Congregation Meeting** after Worship to vote on a By-Law change. This change has been approved by Consistory at their July meeting. The following are recommended revisions to Article VII. A and B.

<u>Current Article VII. A</u>. (2015 Revised By-Laws) – The Consistory is comprised of the 12 voting members (six (6) Deacons and six (6) Elders) along with the Pastor, who is a non-voting member. The Treasurer and Recording Secretary contribute to and participate in the meeting, being held to the same standards as the voting members. If a voting member of the Consistory holds the position of Treasurer or Recording Secretary, he/she shall vote. One half (1/2) of its voting members shall constitute a quorum.

**Proposed Revision** to Article VII. A – The Consistory shall be comprised of 12 voting members. If a full Consistory cannot be staffed, then a minimum of eight (8) voting members is required. The balance of Deacons and Elders may vary from time to time; however, a minimum of four (4) members must be Elders. The Pastor, who is a non-voting member, also participates in Consistory meetings, providing input and guidance. The Treasurer and Recording Secretary contribute to and participate in the meeting, being held to the same standards as the voting members. If a voting member of the Consistory holds the office of Treasurer or Recording Secretary, they shall vote. One half (1/2) of its voting members shall constitute a quorum.

<u>Current Article VII. B</u> (2015 Revised By-Laws) – Two (2) Elders and two (2) Deacons shall be elected by majority vote cast at the regularly scheduled annual meeting. They shall be elected for three (3) year terms. In order to provide continuity, not more than two (2) of each office shall be elected in any one year. If this is not possible due to pre-term resignations, efforts will be made to return to that balance as soon as possible.

The office of Elder or Deacon shall be limited to two (2) consecutive terms. After one year elapses, they will be eligible again for election to office. A member can be elected Elder only after serving at least one (1) term as Deacon in this congregation.

**Proposed Revision** to Article VII. B - Members of the church shall be elected to Consistory by majority vote cast at the regularly scheduled annual meeting. They shall be elected for two (2) year terms. If it is their desire, members will be elected to the position (Deacon or Elder) previously held at this or any other UCC Church. If an elected individual has not previously served, they will be elected as a Deacon. After an initial term, or any time thereafter, a person may be elevated to the position of Elder.

A member of Consistory, regardless of position, shall be limited to three (3) consecutive terms. After one year elapses, they will again be eligible for election to Consistory.

<u>Proxy Vote</u> - If you cannot make this Special Congregation Meeting a proxy vote slip is included below. They will also be available in the sanctuary. The following rules apply to voting by proxy: Proxy slip must contain your name and signature. Slips may be returned to the church by:

- a. Dropping the slip into the silver box in the back of the sanctuary. Please place in a sealed envelope labeled PROXY VOTE.
- Mailing the slip to the church at PO Box 215, Old Zionsville, PA 18068. Mail must be <u>received</u> by Thursday, September 29<sup>th</sup>
- c. Printing the slip, complete your vote, and scan it. Then email to ozuccoffice@ptd.net no later than Wednesday, September 28<sup>th</sup>.
