The Call to Worship

One: We are summoned by our God to gather in sanctuary to remember and worship. We are summoned to recall the darkness when God's Child, Jesus, passed from his life into death. The Service of Light

One: We will read Scriptures to provide a panoramic view of the Light of God. We will tell stories of how our church shares light and warmth in our community that extends itself around the world.

One: We remember God's true light in mysterious and miraculous ways.

All: God led the way out of the wilderness so the people might be free of fear and captivity.

One: God led us to the place where we could trust God's direction and one another.

We can't believe, Oh God, that you come to us today in the mystery and person of the Resurrected Christ! Surely there are more talented people, more prayerful people, more intelligent people, more faithful people than we are. But today, O God, we remember that you come to us all. Homily/Reflection

*Affirmation of Faith

One: We believe in God, maker and sustainer of earth, sea and sky, and midwife of every life that emerges from the womb of the earth. All: We believe in Jesus Christ. Born of the womb of Mary, he was the first of our kind to live fully the destiny for which we were all created.

One: Healing the broken and serving the poor, liberating the burdened and reconciling heaven and earth, his every action unmasked the evil that waits to enslave us all.

All: Hell, wounded at its heart and filled with bitterness and rage, struck back in fury unrestrained.

One: Jesus was condemned by the religious and crucified by the state. He died forsaken, a man of sorrows. No pain in our hearts or in our planet is unfamiliar to him for he was cast into the jaws of death.

All: Redeeming even death, God raised Jesus from the grave and with wounded hands he embraces us.

One: Jesus ascended into heaven to be everywhere present and there is now nothing beyond the reach of his healing touch.

All: We believe in the Holy Spirit, who raises us from the waters of death, breathes new life into us and declares us to be God's beloved.

One: And we believe Christ came that all may have life.

All: Violence and hatred have done their worst but Christ's reign of peace will conquer. All who trust in Christ, though they die, shall be lifted to life in all its fullness. The grip of suffering will be forever broken, and death shall have no dominion. Amen.
