Call to Worship

12 Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. 2 I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Commissioning of Kathy Latshaw, Delegate to General Synod from PNEC and Daniel Latshaw, visitor of General Synod #34, June 30 - July 4, 2023, Indianapolis, Indiana.

The United Church of Christ gathers as a body at General Synod with representatives from all settings serving as delegates and visitors. During that gathering, worship provides a central role in forming us as a faith community dedicated to remember our past, to celebrate our present, and to envision our future.

Leader: Each of us is connected to God. When we welcome one another, we are welcoming God. A Prophet is a messenger of God like: Moses or Jeremiah, MLK or Greta Thunberg. Prophets may offer messages to: Stop oppression and injustice, Love one another, Feed my sheep, change your ways, care for creation. Sometimes the words are challenging and prophets are ridiculed, dismissed, or rejected. What does Jesus say? We will be rewarded if we welcome prophets. It is as simple as offering a cup of cool water.

Kathy: During the meetings, worship, messages, and many committee meetings, we will be focusing on the call of Jesus. "Anyone who accepts what I do accepts my Father, who sent me. Accepting a messenger of God is as good as being God's messenger. Accepting someone's help is as good as giving someone help. This is a large work I've called you into, but don't be overwhelmed by it. It's best to start small. Give a cool cup of water to someone who is thirsty, for instance. The smallest act of giving or receiving makes you a true apprentice. You won't lose out on a thing."

Leader: One of the big things that will be decided and voted upon during General Synod this year is the change in leadership of the General Minister and President of the UCC, the Rev. John Dorhauer — whose tenure as the UCC national leader will come to a close at the end of this Synod. Associate General Minister the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson — whose candidacy to succeed Dorhauer will be voted on by Synod delegates. There will be many other issues discussed, debated and voted upon. Do you Kathy, agree to listen faithfully to the discussions, share your opinions as you see fit, and cast your votes based on your informed faith?

Kathy: I do with God's help.

Leader: Daniel, do you agree to support Kathy and listen to her as she discusses with you the issues brought up during Synod?

Daniel: I do with God's help.

Leader: As a covenant people, bound together across many churches, Associations and Conferences, we gather as the whole body of the United Church of Christ for General Synod 2023. We come together under the promise of covenant to do the business of the whole church and to bear witness to the work of individual churches, Associations and Conferences. Do you, the members and friends of Old Zionsville UCC, promise to pray for Kathy and Dan as they travel and represent us at this General Synod?

All: We promise our prayers, our love and our care to go with them and the whole delegation from Penn Northeast Conference.

Leader: It is in this light that we send them on their way with blessings as we anticipate their return with reports of what they experienced and how we can support the United Church of Christ Faith family in the future. Amen.
