Scriptures: Genesis 24:34-38, 42-49, 58-67

34 So he said, "I am Abraham's servant. **35** The Lord has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys. **36** And Sarah my master's wife bore a son to my master when she was old, and he has given him all that he has. **37** My master made me swear, saying, 'You shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites in whose land I live, **38** but you shall go to my father's house, to my kindred, and get a wife for my son.'

42 "I came today to the spring and said, 'O Lord, God of my master Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going! 43 I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, "Please give me a little water from your jar to drink,"
44 and who will say to me, "Drink, and I will draw for your camels also"—let

her be the woman whom the Lord has appointed for my master's son. **45** "Before I had finished speaking in my heart, there was Rebekah coming out with her water jar on her shoulder, and she went down to the spring and drew. She said, "I will." **59** So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham's servant and his men. 60 And they blessed Rebekah and said to her, "May you, our sister, become thousands of myriads; may your offspring gain possession of the gates of their foes." 61 Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man, and the servant took Rebekah and went his way. 62 Now Isaac had come from Beerlahai-roi and was settled in the Negeb. 63 Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field, and, looking up, he saw camels coming. **64** And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel 65 and said to the servant, "Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?"
