All: God of extravagant feasts and open invitations, we confess our tables are often small and exclusive. When we should stretch our welcome to others, we limit seats to those we find useful, acceptable, or entertaining. We make plans without accommodating everyone's needs. We choose to leave people out rather than express boundaries that might feel uncomfortable. We choose a shallow sense of peace rather than the deep peace that comes after hard, healing conversations. While you do not require us to include people who cause us to feel unsafe or at risk, you do call us to welcome people we find different, difficult, or annoying. Give us good discernment to include those who challenge us and expand our capacity for compassion so we might love our neighbors as you love us. Amen.
