Dedication of Gifts to the Church October 23, 2023 to October 1, 2025

We give thanks to God for (in no particular order):

- Upgrades to the parsonage as needs arise and our Parsonage Liaison, Robin Yoder
- Carriage House painting and doors of the church painting
- Replaced the broken camera that is outside Pastor's office window in Jan. 2024
- Completion of Windows to The Future project, 2020 2025 a big dedication service was held with special speakers, musical guests, and a slide show to describe the project and how far we came through the period with the help of Cumberland Stained Glass Windows
- SonShine group was added to our roster of groups and committees to sell soft pretzels, other food and miscellaneous items including wooden crosses decorated with bows and silk flowers with proceeds going to the General fund or specified needs
- Permanent caution signs at the cross walk were added with the help of the Township
- Grab bars at the entrance to the choir loft and the sanctuary from the sacristy were installed
- The money from the sponsorship of Silk Flower Altar arrangements instead
 of real flowers was designated for the Windows Fund. Since completed, we
 decided upon designating our Mission Fund as the recipient.
- The compressor on the big silver refrigerator was replaced
- The All Things Free Storage space was enlarged to include a portion of the large Sunday School room and previous Village School/Nursery rooms. Shelving units were donated from the Food Pantry. Phil Rhode had them cleaned and delivered to the church.
- Phil Rhode donated pipe and installation of the curtain rod that separates the room to be Sunday School space during the school year and ATF space year long. ATF paid for the curtain material purchased, altered and installed by Robin Yoder.
- The window high above the Village School entrance was repaired
- Awning at the front sanctuary door was provided by the Outlook committee in memory of Bob and Darlene Schmeltzle plus a light was installed to shine under the awning illuminating the front door
- Two new Microphones for the Bell Choir were received in October 2023
- The new Windows 11 Sound System PC was installed 10/3/2024.
- The new Windows 11 Office PC was installed 6/27/2025.

- A new roof on the cemetery shed was installed, new siding put in place and 2 new signs for 2 of the cemeteries were posted on site.
- Big boiler repair was completed.
- Parking lot across the street and the horseshoe in front of the building were upgraded and striped
- Brenda Seitz, our Administrative Assistant of 22 years, retired in June of 2025. We hired two people to replace her! - an office administrative assistant and a financial Administrative Assistant.
- We thank Diane and Mike Berger, who for 20 years volunteered their time in church grounds maintenance!!
- Church Grounds Maintenance person was hired.
