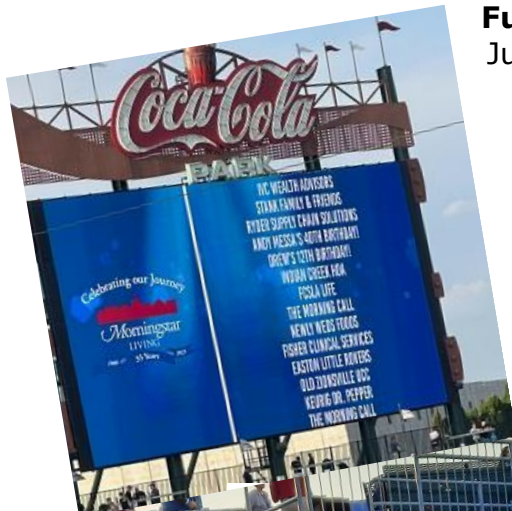

Our own Member: **Mark Weaver** has been inducted into the Coal Region Racing Hall of Fame!

This was determined based on racing performance at Big Diamond Speedway in 1973 and 1974. What follows is a list of his racing history.

Way to go Mark! Be sure to ask him for details about this and the harrowing flip his car took that almost had Linda make him quit racing!!!

Mark Weaver Racing Biography

1968

- Go-Karts – First year – 2nd Place finish in the Junior Championship with Pikeville Karting Association (Kart #39).

1969

- Go-Karts – 1st Place finish in the Junior Championship with Pikeville Karting Association (Kart #2).
- Go-Karts – Traveled to about 15 different Kart Tracks in the Mid-Atlantic Region.

1970

- Go-Karts – 1st Place finish in the Junior Championship with Pikeville Karting Association (Kart #1).
- Go-Karts – Continued traveling to different Kart Tracks in the Mid-Atlantic Region.
- Go-Karts – Won a regional championship race with IKF in Virginia.
- Midgets – Started the restoration of an antique midget, with the intention of running with ARDC at Grandview.

1971

- Go-Karts – 1st Place finish in the Senior Stock Heavy Championship with Pikeville Karting Association (Kart #1).
- Go-Karts – 3rd Place finish in the Senior Modified Championship with Pikeville Karting Association (Kart #1X).
- Midgets – Continued restoration of the antique midget but never raced – sold late in the year.
- Dirt 6 Cyl Late Models – Crew member to a dirt late model team (Car #XL2) that raced at the Grandview.

1972

- Go-Karts – Raced occasionally, no chase for a Championship (Karts #1 and #1X). Sold the Go-Karts.
- Dirt 6 Cyl Late Models – With the help of my Dad (Doc Weaver) and some High School friends, we built a dirt late model to race at Grandview but none of us were old enough to drive – finished 15th in the owner championship with 2 different drivers (Pokey Schuck and Harry Neiman) at Grandview (Car #00)
- Dirt 6 Cyl Late Models – Began traveling to several other tracks with a third hired driver (Smokey Smith). Raced at Penn National and Big Diamond.

1973

- 6 Cyl Late Models – I took over driving the car we built in 1972. Won the first race I entered at the Big Diamond. I won 7 features that year between Grandview and Big Diamond. Finished 2nd in the Championship at Big Diamond and 5th in the Championship at Grandview. Won the “Rookie of the Year” award at both tracks. (Car #00)
Big Diamond: Entered: 24, Qualified: 23, Finished: 21, Top 15: 21, Top 10: 19, Top 5: 16, Wins 5.
Grandview: Entered: 20, Qualified: 19, Finished: 16, Top 15: 14, Top 10: 12, Top 5: 9, Wins: 2.
- 6 Cyl Late Models – We built a second dirt late model for Smokey Smith to drive. He won 4 features between Big Diamond and Grandview. He won the Championship at Big Diamond and finished 3rd in the Championship at Grandview (Car #002)
Big Diamond: Entered: 24, Qualified: 24, Finished: 23, Top 15: 23, Top 10: 23, Top 5: 16, Wins 2.
Grandview: Entered: 20, Qualified: 19, Finished: 15, Top 15: 15, Top 10: 13, Top 5: 8, Wins: 2.
- Small Block Sportsman – At the end of the 1972 season, we sold both dirt late models and purchased a used dirt sportsman. Completed re-construction of the used car over the winter.

1974

- Small Block Sportsman – Raced for the Sportsman Championship at Grandview. Finished 19th in the Championship and won the “Rookie of the Year” award (Car #00).

Big Diamond: Entered: 5, Qualified: 4, Finished: 3, Top 15: 3, Top 10: 3, Top 5: 0, Wins: 0.

Grandview: Entered: 17, Qualified: 10, Finished: 9, Top 15: 9, Top 10: 9, Top 5: 2, Wins 0.

- Small Block Sportsman – Traveled to numerous other racetracks in PA, NJ, NY, and Southern Canada
- Big Block Modifieds – At the end of the Grandview season, we purchased a Big Block engine and converted the car to a Big Block Modified. Raced the last 5 races at the Reading Fairgrounds and qualified for the last 3 races.

1975

- Big Block Modifieds – Raced for the Championship at the Reading Fairgrounds. Finished 25th in points and was runner up for the “Rookie of the Year” Award (Car #00)
- Big Block Modifieds – Occasionally traveled to other tracks in PA and NJ
- Small Block Sportsman – During June and July, we switched the engine back to the small block and took the car on vacation to upstate NY and Southern Canada.

1976

- Big Block Modifieds – Raced for the Championship at the Reading Fairgrounds. Finished 21st in points. (Car #00)
- Small Block Sportsman – During July, we again switched the engine back to the small block and took the car on vacation to upstate NY. Set a 10 lap Track Record at CanAm / LaFargeville, NY.

1977

- Big Block Modifieds – Raced for the Championship at the Reading Fairgrounds. Opening day, I flipped the car 7 times end-over-end and out over the backstretch wall (no serious injury) but decided to hand over the driving chores to hired drivers and I continued as the chief mechanic. Mike Erb, Roger Richter, and Freddie Adam all drove the car that year. Finished 15th in Owner’s Points. (Car #00)

1978

- Big Block Modifieds – Raced for the Championship at the Reading Fairgrounds with Freddie Adam as the exclusive driver. Won a 50 Lap feature and finished 10th in Owner’s points. (Car #00) Since this was to be the last year for the Reading Fairgrounds, we decided to sell the car and get out of the racing business.

1979 thru 1981

- Continued to support Dirt Modified Racing. Built and re-built several cars. Helped as a Crew Mechanic on several cars at various tracks. Built numerous Alcohol Carburetors.

- Big Block Modifieds – In summer of 1981, we purchased a wrecked car that had one of my old engines. Started the rebuild process.

1982

- Big Block Modifieds – Finished the car in time for some late season racing at Nazareth National Speedway 1 mile with Freddie Adam again at the wheel. (Car #00)

1983

- Big Block Modifieds – Raced at Nazareth National for the early season Regional Championship race with Freddie Adam. Then joined a traveling organization called MODCAR and raced several races with Tim Damiani at the wheel. I stepped back into driving for several late season races at Bridgeport, NJ and Williams Grove, PA.

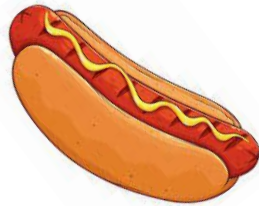

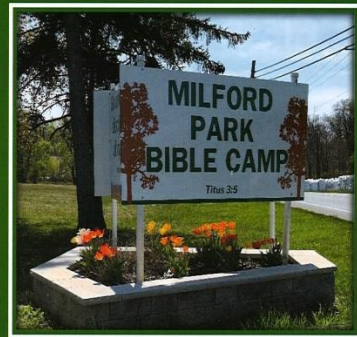
