Lighting of the Hope Candle

This Sunday, many across the globe center on "Hope." Hope is assertive, even aggressive at times. Hope fueled the prophet to call upon God to tear open the heavens and shake the mountains so that we would all tremble, remembering that there is a God, because the world has forgotten. But we have not. We cling to this hope that interrupts and shakes our lives out of monotony, out of complacency, and out of despair. We light this candle, a spark of flame that ignites a rebellion of hope against empire, against hate,

against fear. This is the fire that kindles inside of us and will not die. Let us light this candle of hope as we remember the God-with-us and the hope within us.
