Leader: We have been on a journey of discovery this Advent and Christmas. As our series comes to a close, we ask one more time, “What Child IS This?” One thing is sure, “this, this...” reverberates into our time, our lives, our world as we continue to work for the protection of every child, everywhere.

**What Child is this, who, laid to rest,
